PRACTICE FOCUS

Mr. Delcollo has experience representing employers in the areas of workplace discrimination, workers' compensation, employee handbooks and policies, civil litigation consulting, administrative law, wage and hour issues, non-compete contracts, prevailing wage, government regulatory actions, and breach of contract litigation.
